How long do demerit points normally stay on a driving record?

Correct answer: Two years from the offence date

Demerit points stay on a driving record for two years from the offence date, not the conviction date.

002

What normally happens when a novice driver collects 2 to 5 demerit points?

Correct answer: A warning letter is sent

A novice driver with 2 to 5 points is sent a warning letter.

003

What normally happens when a novice driver collects 6 to 8 demerit points?

Correct answer: A second warning letter is sent

A novice driver with 6 to 8 points is sent a second warning letter.

004

What penalty applies when a novice driver collects 9 or more demerit points?

Correct answer: A 60-day licence suspension

At 9 or more points, a novice driver's licence is suspended for 60 days.

005

What normally happens when a fully licensed driver collects 6 to 8 demerit points?

Correct answer: A warning letter is sent

A fully licensed driver with 6 to 8 points is sent a warning letter.

006

What normally happens when a fully licensed driver collects 9 to 14 demerit points?

Correct answer: A second warning letter is sent

A fully licensed driver with 9 to 14 points is sent a second warning letter.

007

What penalty applies when a fully licensed driver collects 15 or more demerit points?

Correct answer: A 30-day licence suspension

At 15 or more points, a fully licensed driver's licence is suspended for 30 days.

008

What blood-alcohol level is permitted for a G1 driver?

Correct answer: Zero

G1 drivers must maintain zero blood alcohol while driving. An accompanying driver does not change this condition.
